The Devil is sharpening it every day, and churches are handing him the whetstone.

Scripture isn't just inspirational—it's survival. The Word of God is *life or death*. In these last days of deception, division, and doctrinal drift, nothing less than a deep, anchored knowledge of God's Word will keep believers from being swept away. If Satan can't steal your salvation, he'll settle for stealing your sword. And sadly, many have handed it over without a fight.

This essay lays the foundation for a critical series on biblical literacy in the last days. Knowledge in Scripture always ties back to **God's Word**:

Remove the Word, and the light goes out. We are living in a spiritual blackout because Christians have stopped opening their Bibles.

Ask someone to quote a motivational quote from Instagram, and they can rattle off ten. Ask them to recite five verses from memory and they'll stammer. This is the fruit of a generation destroyed by **biblical laziness** and a steady diet of spiritual junk food.

CHAPTER 3: WHEN THE SWORD IS MISSING FROM THE ARMOR

The Armor of God in Ephesians 6 is the classic spiritual warfare checklist. But what's the only offensive weapon in that list?

"And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God." – Ephesians 6:17

A soldier without a sword is useless in battle. And today, we've got churches filled with spiritual streakers—helmet of salvation barely on, no shield, no belt, and **no sword**.

Many believers wouldn't know a false doctrine if it slapped them across the pulpit because they've never learned to wield the sword. They've been told the sword is "too sharp," "too divisive," or "too old-fashioned."

So what replaces it? Smooth words. Therapy sermons. Shallow devotionals. God help us—we are trying to fight an apocalyptic war with motivational quotes and mood boards.

CHAPTER 4: HOW BIBLE ILLITERACY EMPOWERS FALSE TEACHERS

False teachers thrive in environments where the people are unarmed.

“For the time will come when they will not endure sound doctrine; but after their own lusts shall they heap to themselves teachers, having itching ears...” – 2 Timothy 4:3

“We are not as many, which corrupt the word of God...” – 2 Corinthians 2:17

“For the word of God is quick, and powerful, and sharper than any twoedged sword...” – Hebrews 4:12

INTRODUCTION: IF YOU CAN’T BEAT IT, BREAK IT

If Satan could burn every Bible in the world, he would. But even he knows the written Word of God cannot be erased—it is **forever settled in heaven** (Psalm 119:89). So he does the next best thing: **he corrupts it**. He twists it. He dilutes it. He distracts people from it. And tragically, most Christians don’t even realize the war they’re in.

In the first essay, we laid the foundation: **biblical illiteracy is spiritual suicide**. But now we go deeper. It’s not just ignorance of Scripture that’s the problem—it’s **what’s being done to Scripture** by the enemy of your soul.

This isn’t just a debate between translations or doctrine—it’s a **war on the Word**. And it’s a war that began in the Garden of Eden, rages in pulpits and publishing houses today, and will culminate in the great deception of the last days. You must understand how Satan works **with Scripture** if you want to survive the spiritual minefield ahead.

CHAPTER 1: THE FIRST ATTACK – TWISTING THE WORD

“Yea, hath God said...?” – Genesis 3:1

Paul’s writings were already being **wrested** (twisted) in the first century. Satan wastes no time. The same twisting continues today under religious names and spiritual language—but it’s still the Serpent’s voice.

CHAPTER 2: DELETING THE WORD – THE ASSAULT OF MODERN TRANSLATIONS

When Satan can’t twist the Word enough to make it work for him, he moves to **deleting it** altogether. And this is exactly what modern Bible versions have done.

“For we are not as many, which corrupt the word of God...” – 2 Corinthians 2:17

The Greek word here for “corrupt” is *kapeleuó*, meaning to water down or **peddle for profit**. Modern publishers are doing both. They sell new “versions” of the Bible every few years with minor updates, omissions, or modern phrasing—all in the name of clarity or relevance.

Let’s be blunt: **this is not preservation**. This is **satanic subtraction**.

Examples of deletion:

1. **Matthew 18:11 (KJV):**

“For the Son of man is come to save that which was lost.”

– Deleted in NIV, ESV, and others.

2. **Acts 8:37 (KJV):**

“If thou believest with all thine heart, thou mayest.”

– Deleted in most modern versions.

3. **1 John 5:7 (KJV):**

“For there are three that bear record in heaven, the Father, the Word, and the Holy Ghost: and these three are one.”

– Guttered in virtually every modern translation.

4. **Luke 4:4 (KJV):**

“...but by every word of God.”

– Removed in NIV and others.

This isn't random. These omissions attack **key doctrines**—the deity of Christ, the Trinity, and salvation.

The Devil is editing God's Word in plain sight, and most Christians are buying it on Amazon.

CHAPTER 3: REDEFINING THE WORD – CORRUPT LEXICONS AND COMMENTARIES

It's not just the text—it's the **tools** being used to interpret it. Satan doesn't need to erase a verse if he can redefine the meaning of the words inside it.

Most believers today rely on Greek lexicons and commentaries compiled by men who **did not believe in the inerrancy or authority of Scripture**. Names like Westcott and Hort, Nestle-Aland, or even popular Strong's Concordance entries often smuggle in theological bias that undermines the text.

“God was manifest in the flesh...” (1 Timothy 3:16 KJV)

→ Modern Greek texts replace “God” with “He” based on corrupt manuscripts.

“Lucifer” (Isaiah 14:12 KJV)

→ Completely removed or replaced in most modern translations.

And if Lucifer is erased from the Bible, guess who gets to hide in plain sight?

Redefining biblical terms like *repentance*, *hell*, *sin*, *judgment*, or *grace* makes people feel safe in their heresy. It's not just about reading the Bible anymore—it's about **what Bible**, and **which definitions**.

CHAPTER 4: DISTRACTING FROM THE WORD – ENTERTAINMENT, EMOTIONS, AND EMPTY TEACHING

Even if Satan can't delete or distort the Word in your life, he can simply **distract you** from it.

The average Christian spends hours a day scrolling, watching, or bingeing—but maybe five minutes (if any) in Scripture. Meanwhile, sermons are becoming more about **feeling good** than *knowing truth*.

“For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat. For every one that useth milk is unskilful in the word of righteousness: for he is a babe. But strong meat belongeth to them that are of full age, even

those who by reason of use have their senses exercised to discern both good and evil.”
— **Hebrews 5:12–14**

INTRODUCTION: DIET DETERMINES STRENGTH

There is a famine in the land—not of food or water, but of **sound doctrine**. Most Christians are spiritually malnourished, surviving on milk when they should be thriving on meat. Hebrews 5:12–14 lays bare the tragic state of God’s people: **many who should be teachers are still toddlers in the truth**.

This essay is about **growing up**. Not just emotionally or morally—but **doctrinally**. If you’re going to stand in the last days, you won’t do it with a milk mustache. You’ll need strong meat—truth that’s been chewed, digested, and turned into muscle.

And here’s the painful truth: The modern Church is addicted to milk. Shallow sermons, soft doctrines, and spiritual pacifiers have become the norm. But the remnant—the real Body of Christ—is called to more. This essay is a wake-up call to go beyond the bottle and into the meat of God’s Word.

CHAPTER 1: THE PROBLEM OF PERPETUAL INFANCY

“Ye have need that one teach you again...” — Hebrews 5:12

The writer of Hebrews isn’t speaking to new converts. He’s speaking to people who’ve **had time to grow**—but didn’t. And now, they need a **rerun** of the basics.

In 2 Timothy 2:15, Paul commands us to **“rightly divide”** the word of truth. This is not just good advice—it’s the line between **truth and heresy**, between **clarity and confusion**, between **doctrinal life and death.** To rightly divide is to cut straight. To twist is to tangle.

This essay will break down what it means to rightly divide the Word, how it differs from modern-day “wresting” of the Scriptures, and why it is the most important interpretive skill every believer must master—especially in these final days of deception.

CHAPTER 1: RIGHTLY DIVIDING—THE COMMAND, NOT A SUGGESTION

“*Rightly dividing the word of truth.*” – 2 Timothy 2:15

The phrase “rightly divide” in Greek is *orthotoméo*—to cut straight, like a craftsman or surgeon. This isn’t about randomly applying verses. It’s about knowing:

The result is a mangled mess of misunderstood texts—and **millions deceived**.

CHAPTER 2: WHY DIVISION IS NECESSARY

Some Christians bristle at the word “division.” “We need unity!” they say. But truth can’t unite unless it **first divides**.

“*For the word of God is quick, and powerful... dividing asunder...*” – Hebrews 4:12

God Himself is a divider:

- He divided light from darkness (Genesis 1:4).

Paul wasn't arrogant—he was **accurate**. God gave him a revelation of the Church that **was not made known before** (Eph. 3:5).

Here’s how to apply 2 Timothy 2:15 in your Bible reading:

1. Ask: Who is speaking?

Is it God, man, Satan, or a prophet?

2. Ask: Who are they speaking to?

Israel? The Gentiles? The Church?

3. Ask: When is this happening?

Old Covenant? Church Age? Tribulation? Millennium?

4. Ask: What covenant or dispensation is in effect?

Law or grace?

5. Cross-reference.

Never build a doctrine on one verse. Let Scripture interpret Scripture.

6. Keep Paul’s gospel central.

Measure all doctrines by the revelation given to Paul for the Church.

- “Speak blessings into your future.” (Witchcraft, not Scripture.)

T.D. Jakes

Modalist theology (denies the Trinity), yet heavily quoted by many Christians.

Scripture manipulation:

Uses emotionally charged delivery to override the actual meaning of the text. Often reads into Scripture more than from it.

Steven Furtick

Known for twisting meanings to fit sermon themes.

Once claimed: “*I am God Almighty.*”—in reference to what God says *through* you.

Tactic:

Turn deep theological texts into soundbites and call it “revelation.”

Andy Stanley

Has openly stated we need to “unhitch from the Old Testament.”

Downplays biblical authority.

Tactic:

Replace Scripture with culturally acceptable moralism.

CHAPTER 5: WHAT TRUE TEACHERS DO DIFFERENTLY

“*Rightly dividing the word of truth.*” – 2 Timothy 2:15

Here’s what a sound, God-honoring teacher will do:

1. Use the King James Bible.
