Why Demons Crave Water, the Mystery of the Swine, and Christ's Authority Over the Seas

There's a strange and haunting pattern that runs through Scripture—a pattern that connects demons to the deep, the chaotic, the watery unknown. It's a pattern we often overlook because we're focused on the surface: a possessed man, a herd of pigs, a violent storm, a calm sea. But dig just a little deeper, and you'll discover that when Jesus

confronted Legion in the land of the Gadarenes, He wasn't just healing a man. He was declaring authority over an ancient enemy—one that slithers through water, that craves flesh, and that remembers the judgment of Noah's flood.

Let's get into the Word and follow this trail.

The Scene at Gadara: A Man, a Legion, and a Sea

The story is recorded in *Mark 5*, *Matthew 8*, and *Luke 8*. Jesus crosses the Sea of Galilee with His disciples and is immediately met by a man possessed with **many devils**. When asked his name, the response is chilling:

“My name is Legion: for we are many.” (Mark 5:9)

This man is not simply troubled. He's overtaken. He lives among tombs, cuts himself, breaks chains, and screams night and day. It is the most detailed and horrifying demonic possession recorded in the Gospels.

But what's more telling is **where** this happens: **on the edge of the sea**.

And what do the demons request?

“Send us into the swine... and forthwith Jesus gave them leave. And the unclean spirits went out, and entered into the swine: and the herd ran violently down a steep place into the sea.” (Mark 5:12–13)

Why?

Why would unclean spirits request to be cast into pigs—and then drive those pigs directly into water?

Why Demons Crave Water

Scripture gives us subtle but consistent clues that **unclean spirits crave water, but cannot dwell in it**.

In *Luke 11:24*, Jesus said:

“When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through **dry places**, seeking rest; and finding none, he saith, I will return unto my house whence I came out.”

This sounds contradictory at first—why do they roam dry places but still want to go into the sea? The key is understanding what "dry" represents here: **absence of a host**. Without a human (or animal) to inhabit, they are disembodied, restless, and tormented.

In *Matthew 12:43*, the verse is repeated again. Demons are seeking a home—something to **attach to**, something to **invade**. And when they can't, they grow desperate.

So why the water?

Because water is their **judgment**. They were drowned in it once. They know its terror.

The Flood: Where Demons Were Born

Let's rewind to *Genesis 6*, where the "sons of God" (fallen angels) took wives of the daughters of men and bore giants—**Nephilim**. This unholy union corrupted the earth to such a degree that God brought a flood to **wipe out all flesh**.

What happened to the spirits of those giant hybrids—the Nephilim?

They were neither human nor angel. They were abominations. They were **not born of the will of God**.

So what became of their spirits?

They drowned in the flood... and **became disembodied spirits**—what we now know as **demons**.

They weren't created by God to dwell in heaven. They weren't men to enter into paradise or Sheol. They were freaks of rebellion, cursed to wander without rest.

And where did they **die**? In water.

This is why water, to them, is both a **reminder** and a **portal**.

Why the Swine?

Let's go back to *Mark 5*. Why would demons beg to enter swine? Because they crave a **host**.

They had once possessed a man—one man, holding a **Legion** of them. That's thousands. Which already debunks the idea that demons are fallen angels. You cannot fit thousands of angels into one human body. But you can fit **parasites**. And that's what these things are—spiritual parasites. Feeders. Leeches of the soul.

Demons need bodies. And when they were being cast out by the authority of Jesus Christ, they knew they had nowhere to go. So they begged for pigs. And once inside them, what did the pigs do?

They **committed mass suicide**.

Why? Because even swine—unclean as they are—couldn't bear the torment of being possessed by them. The pigs would rather drown than live with the spirits that once dwelled in the Nephilim.

And here's the chilling irony: they drowned the same way the Nephilim did.

These spirits were trying to **return to the place of their origin**, thinking they could hide, linger, or escape judgment. But it didn't work. And Jesus let them go—not because He couldn't destroy them—but because He was **exposing them**.

Jesus Walking on Water: More Than a Miracle

Why does Jesus walk on water? Why did the storm suddenly stop when He spoke?

Beaches, Waters, and Spiritual Hotspots

Beelzebub – The Lord of the Flies

Disproving the “Fallen Angel” Theory Using the Bible and Showing Why Demons Are the Spirits of the Nephilim

There’s a widespread assumption in the modern church that demons are fallen angels. It’s been repeated in pulpits, popular books, and even Christian films for years. But the problem isn’t just that it’s oversimplified—it’s that it’s **not biblical**.

The Bible makes **clear distinctions** between fallen angels and demons. They are not the same beings, they don’t operate in the same ways, and they don’t suffer the same fate. And when you trace their origins back to the time before the flood, a chilling truth emerges:

Demons are the disembodied spirits of the Nephilim. They are abominations—never meant to exist, cursed to wander, and desperate for a host.

Let’s break this down and dismantle the fallen angel theory with the Word of God, not tradition.

I. Fallen Angels: Bound and Judged, Not Roaming Free

Let’s start with what the Bible **does** say about fallen angels.

“And the angels which kept not their first estate, but left their own habitation, he hath reserved in everlasting chains under darkness unto the judgment of the great day.”

— *Jude 1:6*

That verse alone dismantles the idea that fallen angels are freely roaming the earth. These angels—clearly referring to the ones from *Genesis 6*—are not running around causing demonic activity. They are **chained** in **darkness** until the final judgment.

Peter confirms this:

“For if God spared not the angels that sinned, but cast them down to hell, and delivered them into chains of darkness, to be reserved unto judgment...”

— 2 Peter 2:4

This isn't metaphorical. These are the specific angels who left their heavenly estate, took on flesh, and **cohabited with women**, producing **giants**. And because of this, they were punished **immediately**—not just spiritually, but geographically. They were bound in **Tartarus**, the Greek word used in Peter's epistle, referring to the lowest abyss of hell.

So again, if these fallen angels are **already bound**, who or what are demons?

II. The Origin of Demons: Genesis 6 and the Birth of the Nephilim

The Bible says in *Genesis 6:1–4*:

“The sons of God saw the daughters of men that they were fair; and they took them wives of all which they chose... There were **giants** in the earth in those days; and also after that, when the sons of God came in unto the daughters of men...”

The term “sons of God” is not used for human men until after the resurrection (see *John 1:12*). Before that, it refers to **direct creations of God**, such as angels (*Job 38:7*).

The “giants” (Hebrew: **Nephilim**) were not just tall humans. They were **hybrids**—part angelic, part human. They had **no soul** as Adam's race does. They were born outside of God's design and therefore **beyond redemption**.

When God saw that the whole earth was corrupted with this genetic evil, He sent the flood—not just because people were sinful, but because the bloodlines of humanity were being genetically hijacked.

And when the waters rose and the Nephilim perished physically, something **unnatural happened**:

Their **bodies died**, but their **spirits remained**.

They were not created in God's image. They were not men. And they were not angels. They were **abominations**—illegal lifeforms.

Their spirits became **unclean spirits—demons**.

III. Demons Need Bodies. Angels Do Not.

Here's one of the clearest biblical distinctions:

Angels appear in bodily form and don't require possession.

Demons crave bodies. They are desperate for them.

Consider the angels who visited Abraham in *Genesis 18*. They walked. They sat. They ate food. They spoke. They were mistaken for men. Nowhere does it say they needed to possess anyone.

Contrast that with *Mark 5:12*, where the demons in the man called Legion **beg Jesus to enter into pigs**. That is desperation.

“Send us into the swine, that we may enter into them.”

Why would they do that? Why would a so-called "angel" want to go into a pig?

Because these are not angels. They are **unclean spirits**, cursed to roam without form unless they invade one.

IV. One Body, a Thousand Demons? Not Possible for Angels

Let's think practically.

In *Mark 5:9*, when Jesus asked the possessed man his name, the answer was:

“My name is Legion: for we are many.”

A Roman legion could number up to **6,000**. Whether literal or symbolic, the implication is clear—**thousands of demons** were inside **one man**.

Could thousands of angels physically fit inside one man?

Absolutely not.

This is further proof that demons are not beings with glorified, independent, angelic bodies. They are **disembodied, spiritual, and parasitic**.

They can swarm. They can layer. They can infect. But they are **not angels**.

V. Jesus Differentiated Between Angels and Spirits

Jesus Himself made distinctions between spirits and angels.

“Handle me, and see; for a spirit hath not flesh and bones, as ye see me have.”

— *Luke 24:39*

And in *Luke 20:36*, speaking of the resurrected righteous:

“Neither can they die any more: for they are equal unto the angels...”

Angels do **not** die. They are created beings, eternal until judged. But demons were **born**, they **died in the flood**, and their spirits **wander**.

Jesus also said of an unclean spirit:

“When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through dry places, seeking rest...”

— *Luke 11:24*

Spirits wander. Angels do not. They travel with purpose, command, and form. Spirits drift like mist, desperate to possess flesh again.

VI. Extra-Biblical Confirmations (for Context, Not Doctrine)

While we don’t build doctrine on extra-biblical texts, early Jews and early Christians held this belief about demons being the spirits of the giants.

In the *Book of Enoch* (which is referenced in Jude but not Scripture), it says:

“And now the giants, who are produced from the spirits and flesh, shall be called evil spirits upon the earth... because they are born from men and from the holy Watchers is their beginning and primal origin; they shall be evil spirits on earth...” (*1 Enoch 15:8–9*)

Even the early church writers—Justin Martyr, Irenaeus, and others—understood that **demons** came from the Nephilim.

Again, not to elevate these writings, but to show that the **original understanding** was very different from today’s simplistic “fallen angels = demons” model.

VII. The Greek Word “Daimonion” vs. “Aggelos”

In the New Testament, the word **angel** is always “aggelos.” The word **demon** is always “daimonion.” They are used distinctly.

- **Aggelos** (ἄγγελος) = messenger, angelic being

- **Daimonion (δαιμόνιον)** = unclean spirit, evil spirit, demon

Never once does the Bible **conflate** the two.

You can't argue from silence. If demons were fallen angels, why didn't Paul or Peter or Jesus ever say so?

Because they're not.

VIII. Why This Matters: Authority and Deception

If demons are just fallen angels, then it's easy to dismiss them as remote, ethereal threats.

But if demons are **disembodied Nephilim**, then we understand:

- They once lived among us.
- They are territorial.
- They are **desperate**.
- They hate mankind because they can never be redeemed.
- They imitate human traits to deceive.
- They crave hosts—**especially believers who let down their guard**.

And if demons are **not angels**, then casting them out isn't a mystical event—it's a **command by spiritual authority**.

Jesus said:

“In my name shall they cast out devils.” (Mark 16:17)

Not angels. **Devils**.

In *Revelation 20:10*, Satan and his angels are cast into the **lake of fire**.

But what about demons?

They get **judged** differently.

- In *Matthew 8:29*, the demons ask Jesus:

They know there is a **specific appointed time** when they will be judged. And it terrifies them.

They also fear **the deep**:

“And they besought him that he would not command them to go out into the deep.”

— *Luke 8:31*

The “deep” here is the **abyss**—the place where their origin began in water, and where their judgment will begin again.

Fallen angels are bound in chains.

Demons are loose, for now—but the **clock is ticking**.

Unpacking the Parasitic Nature of Unclean Spirits and Why Beelzebub Is More Literal Than We Think

There's a name in Scripture that sounds absurd to modern ears—**Beelzebub**, the so-called “Lord of the Flies.” To the casual reader, it might seem like a mock title, a figure of speech, or even a metaphorical jab. But in reality, Beelzebub is more than a nickname.

It's a window into the **true nature** of demonic forces.

You see, flies aren't just dirty little insects. They are **parasitic, necrotic, disease-carrying, and deeply symbolic of decay and death**. And the more you study flies, the more you realize that the comparison to demonic spirits is far from symbolic—it's **uncannily accurate**.

Demons are not only abominations of the Nephilim—they are **spiritual parasites**. They feed off life, infest the mind, lay spiritual “eggs” in wounded souls, and multiply in filth.

Let's unpack this disturbing parallel and expose the horrifying truth behind one of Satan's most literal titles.

I. Who Is Beelzebub?

Let's begin with the name itself.

In *Matthew 12:24*, the Pharisees accuse Jesus of casting out devils “by Beelzebub the prince of the devils.”

“But when the Pharisees heard it, they said, This fellow doth not cast out devils, but by Beelzebub the prince of the devils.” – *Matthew 12:24*

Beelzebub (Greek: Βεελζεβούλ) comes from the Hebrew **Ba'al-zebûb**, meaning “*lord of the flies*.” Some versions render it “*Baal of the dung heap*”—which isn't much better.

This figure was originally a **Philistine god** worshiped at Ekron (2 Kings 1:2–3), possibly invoked to protect from disease or plagues, which in itself is ironic—calling on the lord of flies to cure disease is like asking maggots to clean a wound.

But in the New Testament, Beelzebub is no longer just a pagan idol—he is referred to as the “**prince of devils**” (Matt. 12:24) and becomes **synonymous with Satan himself**.

That's no exaggeration.

Jesus responds:

“If Satan cast out Satan, he is divided against himself...” – *Matthew 12:26*

The implication? Beelzebub and Satan are either the same entity or part of the same spiritual leadership.

Either way, Jesus affirms that this title **matters**.

So what does it really mean to be “the lord of the flies”?

Let’s find out.

II. The Nature of Flies: Parasitic, Decaying, Filthy

Flies are not just an annoyance. They are **vectors of filth, decay, and disease**. And almost every trait of a fly corresponds to the operation of a demon.

Consider the common characteristics of flies:

- **They thrive on decay.** Flies are attracted to rotting meat, feces, garbage, and decomposing organic matter.

- They **fester in darkness**, and their activity multiplies in secrecy.

It's no accident that Beelzebub is the **lord of the flies**. He is the **king of infestation**—the ruler of spiritual maggots that feed on the rotting flesh of fallen humanity.

In *Romans 8:8*, Paul writes:

“So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God.”

The **flesh** is the prime environment for demonic activity.

Just like a fly searches for rotting meat, demons search for **flesh-led lives**—those consumed by lust, pride, addiction, or rebellion. The more a person operates in the flesh, the more they begin to **spiritually rot**, attracting spiritual pests.

Paul writes:

“For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.”
– *2 Tim. 1:7*

If your mind is not sound, you need to examine what's been allowed to **hover around your thoughts**.

VI. The Role of Fasting and Cleansing

How do you get rid of flies?

You don't start with swatting. You start with **cleaning the environment**.

The same is true for demons.

You want to get rid of Beelzebub's agents? You must:

- Clean out your spiritual garbage.
- Seal the wounds.
- Shut the doors.
- Starve the flesh.

That's why **fasting** is so effective.

"This kind goeth not out but by prayer and fasting." – *Matt. 17:21*

Fasting **weakens the flesh**, starves the infestation, and strengthens the spirit. Demons hate it because it removes the filth they feast on.

It's like draining the swamp to kill the mosquitoes.

VII. The Stench of Sin and the Fragrance of Christ

Flies are drawn to **stench**. Demons are drawn to **sin**.

Paul uses the image of smell to describe both:

"We are unto God a sweet savour of Christ..." – *2 Corinthians 2:15*

"Let it not be once named among you, as becometh saints..." – *Ephesians 5:3*

There is a **spiritual aroma** about every believer. When your life is holy, it smells like **worship** to heaven—and like **death** to hell.

But when sin festers unconfessed, when bitterness rots and lust boils, the stench rises—and with it, come the flies.

Your spiritual scent matters.

VIII. Beelzebub and End-Time Deception

Beelzebub isn't a distant Philistine god. He is **alive and active** today.

And as we near the end of this age, his tactics become more aggressive, more visible, and more disgusting.

- **Filth is normalized.**
- **Rotten culture is celebrated.**
- **Spiritual parasites are labeled as personality quirks.**
- **Open wounds are made fashionable.**

Demons now hide in plain sight—in music, media, psychology, education. The buzzing is everywhere. The flies are swarming.

But most churches are still swatting at symptoms—**instead of removing the garbage.**

IX. The Cross as the Ultimate Fly Trap

Here's the good news: The Cross is the **death of infestation.**

At Calvary, Jesus bore our filth. He entered the rot of humanity. He was mocked, torn, crucified—but not infested.

Why?

Because He was **without sin.** The flies had no landing ground. Death couldn't hold Him. The grave couldn't decay Him.

And when He rose, He did so with the authority to **cleanse us completely.**

“The blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin.” – *1 John 1:7*

That word “cleanseth” is present tense. It keeps cleansing. It keeps healing. It keeps repelling spiritual flies.

When you apply the blood of Jesus to your life, you are marking yourself with a **spiritual repellent**—a fragrance the enemy hates and cannot endure.

Because the Lord of the Flies is real...

...but his wings melt in the fire of holiness.

4 of 9: Where Demons Dwell – The Dry Places

What Happens When a Demon Is Cast Out, Where They Go, and How They Return Stronger if the Vessel Is Empty

Jesus gave us a rare glimpse into the unseen realm with a short, chilling statement:

“When the unclean spirit is gone out of a man, he walketh through **dry places**, seeking rest, and findeth none. Then he saith, I will return into my house from whence I came out; and when he is come, he findeth it empty, swept, and garnished. Then goeth he, and taketh with himself **seven other spirits more wicked than himself**, and they enter in and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first.”

— *Matthew 12:43–45*

This is not parable. It is not poetic imagery. This is **Jesus Christ describing the literal behavior of unclean spirits**—how they operate when they are cast out, what they look for, how they return, and why some people end up worse than before after deliverance.

It also tells us something very few modern Christians want to admit:

Deliverance is not the end of the battle—it is the beginning.

Let’s explore the terrain Jesus called “**dry places**” and uncover the terrifying truth about what happens after a demon is cast out—and how to keep the doors shut forever.

I. What Are the “Dry Places”?

When Jesus says a spirit walks through “dry places,” He’s not referring to deserts in a physical sense. This is a **spiritual terrain**—an invisible realm where disembodied spirits roam **in torment, in restlessness, and in search of a new host**.

Let’s break it down:

- “**Dry**” in Scripture often represents the **absence of life**, of water, of blessing.
- In contrast, the Holy Spirit is described as **living water** (John 7:38).
- The Word of God is compared to **rain** and **dew** (Deut. 32:2).
- The believer is promised to be like a **tree planted by rivers of water** (Psalm 1:3).

So dry places are where **none of God’s presence exists**.

It is the **wilderness of judgment**, the land of torment for unclean spirits who cannot find rest unless they dwell in a person. That’s their unnatural craving—to live *through* someone else.

The demon, once cast out, begins a search—not for rest, not for heaven, not for repentance, but for **another home**.

II. The Restlessness of Demons

Notice what Jesus says:

“He walketh through dry places, seeking rest, and findeth none.” (*Matt. 12:43*)

Demons are **restless**. Unlike angels, who operate with order, assignments, and heavenly alignment, **unclean spirits are wandering parasites**. They are the ghost-like leftovers of the Nephilim (see Essay 2), cursed to drift in the void, unable to reincarnate, unable to be redeemed, and unable to rest.

They are spiritual squatters. They don’t have a home unless they hijack one.

And they are not content until they **possess** something.

III. The House Analogy: Why Demons Call You “Home”

In verse 44, the unclean spirit says something deeply disturbing:

“I will return into **my house** from whence I came out...”

Did you catch that?

The demon **claims ownership** over the person. That’s how deeply these spirits embed themselves. To them, **you are property**, a vessel, a house they once lived in. And if evicted, they want back in.

Jesus doesn’t correct the terminology. Why?

Because if a person allows demonic influence long enough, it becomes a **stronghold**—a place the demon has legal ground to enter, inhabit, and operate.

Deliverance removes them.

But **cleansing keeps them out**.

IV. What Happens When the House Is Empty

This is the most terrifying part of the passage:

“And when he is come, he findeth it **empty, swept, and garnished**.” (*Matt. 12:44*)

Let’s unpack those three adjectives:

1. **Empty** – There is no indwelling Spirit of God. The person has not been filled with the Holy Ghost. They are spiritually vacant.
2. **Swept** – The external behavior may have improved. The addiction stopped. The symptoms vanished. But the heart has not been transformed.
3. **Garnished** – The outside looks pretty. They got their life together. They joined a church. Maybe they started talking about God. But they are still **unconverted**.

This is what happens when people seek **deliverance without salvation, or freedom without filling**.

The demon sees the house and says: *“Perfect. It’s clean—but no one’s home. Time to move back in.”*

V. The Reinvasion: Seven Spirits Worse Than Before

This is the escalation Jesus warns of:

“Then goeth he, and taketh with himself **seven other spirits more wicked than himself**, and they enter in and dwell there: and the last state of that man is worse than the first.”
(Matt. 12:45)

Why seven?

Seven in Scripture represents **completeness, fullness, and total control**.

The implication is that the returning spirit doesn’t come alone. He comes with a **team**, a **swarm**, and an upgrade in wickedness.

The person is now not only possessed again—they are **enslaved more deeply** than before. This is why people who “got clean” often end up worse when they fall back into sin. The enemy returns with a vengeance.

The stakes are **not** just backsliding.

They are **complete destruction**.

VI. Examples of Reinvasion Today

We see this pattern everywhere today:

- A man gets sober through a rehab program, but six months later relapses—and ends up overdosing.
- A woman leaves an abusive occult relationship, but years later falls into New Age practices and ends up in deep demonic bondage.
- A teenager stops cutting himself after a spiritual high at youth camp, but returns home without discipleship and ends up suicidal again within a year.

Why?

Because the demon left... but the house stayed **empty**.

Churches have become skilled at **sweeping** and **garnishing** people, but not **filling** them. We offer therapy, advice, motivation—but not **Holy Ghost fire**.

So the spirit returns.

And with him come seven more.

VII. The Dry Places Can Become Permanent

The “dry places” are not hell—yet.

But for many demons, they are a foretaste of their torment.

Remember in *Luke 8:31*, when Legion begged Jesus:

“They besought him that he would not command them to go out into the **deep**.”

That word “deep” is **abussos** in Greek—the **abyss**, the place of restraint for evil spirits.

The dry places are the borderlands before the abyss. And every time a demon is cast out, he knows that time is running out.

So the urgency to find a new host becomes greater.

If he fails, he drifts.

If he returns and finds access, he infests.

If the person has turned to Jesus in truth and is sealed, the door is shut forever.

But if not...

The spirit will make himself at home again.

VIII. The Holy Spirit as the Seal Against Return

The only way to remain free is not just to be **cleansed**, but to be **filled**.

When you are born again, the Holy Spirit comes to **dwell in you**:

“Know ye not that your body is the temple of the Holy Ghost...?” – *1 Cor. 6:19*

A demon will not and **cannot** cohabit with the Spirit of God.

But many people get **deliverance without conversion**.

The Word is water to the soul. It keeps your life from becoming a dry place.
4. **Worship and Prayer**
Praise creates an atmosphere demons can't stand.
5. **Guard the Gates**
Eyes, ears, mouth—what you watch, listen to, and speak. Don't give place to the devil (Eph. 4:27).

6. **Destroy the Old Altars**

Get rid of occult objects, cursed items, and old soul ties. No spiritual squatters allowed.

7. **Stay in Community**

Isolation breeds infestation. Stay in fellowship with strong believers.

You are not just trying to survive—you are fortifying a temple.

X. Final Reflection: Don't Be the Empty House

Many Christians want freedom.

Few want **discipline**.

Many want demons gone.

Few want the **Spirit enthroned**.

But the truth is clear:

- You can't just cast out.
- You must fill in.
- You can't just clean up.
- You must **surrender completely**.

The dry places are real.

And so is the danger of being **empty**.

Jesus didn't just come to give us a better life. He came to make us **a dwelling place**—for His Spirit, His power, His presence.

And when He moves in... there's **no vacancy** for anything else.
