- Several locations have a high seismic risk (e.g., San Francisco, Istanbul, Lisbon).
- Liquefaction could cause rapid burial of ground-level floors.

Theory 2: Firestorms and Ashfall Events

Possible. Especially since many 19th-century photographs show streets covered in **dark sludge** after such events.

But again—these disasters were **regional**, not global. And they left **charred remains**, not **perfectly preserved buried windows**.

Which leads us beyond mere natural explanations—into supernatural territory.

Theory 3: Directed Energy or Advanced Technology
