Beyond national finance, debt as a weapon has filtered down to the individual. Credit cards, student loans, car payments, mortgages—it's all designed to create a population that is dependent, distracted, and disempowered.

This series isn't about Ronald Bernard. It's about **equipping the body of Christ** with discernment.

- **We must stop separating "spiritual warfare" from economic and political systems.**
They're intertwined. Babylon was a commercial *and* spiritual power (Revelation 18).
- **We must stop assuming everyone who exposes darkness is walking in light.**
Truth without Christ is just another form of control.
- **We must be bold enough to name evil, but anchored enough to point to the only cure.**
The answer is not activism. It's not detoxing from media. It's not alternative economies. It's the **Gospel of Jesus Christ**.

The Real "Reset" Is Coming

While the world obsesses over Great Resets, climate crises, and digital currencies, Scripture points to something far more final:

"And he shall judge among the nations..." (Isaiah 2:4)

"The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord..." (Revelation 11:15)

God has His own reset planned. And it doesn't come with a Davos keynote or a CBDC launch date — it comes with fire, judgment, and a white horse (Revelation 19:11).

Final Exhortation

Beloved, don't let your exposure to evil rob you of your love for righteousness.

Don't let your hunger for hidden knowledge replace your appetite for God's Word.

Don't let your suspicion of the system pull you away from the Savior.

Use this series to warn others. Use it to awaken sleeping saints. Use it to tear down strongholds. But **never trade the Word of God for the words of whistleblowers.**

They may have seen something. But the Bible has seen *everything*.

The Truth Is Not Hidden. It's Revealed.

Ronald Bernard whispered what Jesus Christ already shouted from the rooftops:

“For there is nothing covered, that shall not be revealed; neither hid, that shall not be known.”

— *Luke 12:2*

The truth is not buried in vaults or codes or lodges.

It's in plain sight — **in a Book that never lies, never changes, and never bows to the beast.**

So when they ask you why you wrote this...

When they say, “But why would you listen to someone like Bernard?”

Just tell them:

Because even liars sometimes echo the truth.

Because even darkness sometimes exposes itself.

But mostly...

Because my Bible said it first.

And now we watch.

And we wait.

Not for the next exposé —

...but for the **return of the King.**
